# HISTORY OF LOS OSOS

General Membership Meeting 7pm Monday September 14th

Have you ever wondered where the Chumash camped in our area? Who first settled the Los Osos/Baywood Park area? Why Los Osos Valley Road goes where it goes? Who went to school in the little schoolhouse in the park? Why there are row trees in Baywood Park? Mark P. Hall-Patton, the director of the San Luis Obispo Historical Museum, will be with us at our next general meeting to answer these questions and many others about the history of Los Osos and Baywood Park. Mr. Hall-Patton will show slides to illustrate this presentation which should give us new insights about the origins and development of the community.

SWAP has played an important role in developing the character of Los Osos since the 1970's, so we will also include a short presentation showing how our land preservation group has made history in Los Osos as well. Join us and bring a friend for a new perspective on the community surrounding the Elfin Forest.

## First Half-Million Raised

On July 14 the California Transportation Commission approved a \$500,000 environmental enhancement and mitigation grant for the Elfin Forest. The application was ranked #1 in all Southern California. BRAVO! and THANK YOU to Rose Bowker and Barbara Machado, heads of our very successful grant writing team! Among other projects approved was a reforestation project along Highway 46, applied for by the San Luis Obispo County Land Conservancy.

SWAP and Tim Gallagher, SLO County Parks Director, were notified of the award by the San Luis Area Coordinating Council, which will also oversee the funding. With this substantial sum committed, the Site Committee and SWAP Board will look at options for the immediate future. In the meantime, the fund raising effort goes on and is more important than ever.

Yolanda Waddell and Pat Grimes are moving forward on a Wetlands grant application. Barbara Machado is working on a Bank of America Environmental Community Grant. Elsie Deitz continues to work on business solicitation and distribution of SWAP's major fund raising brochure, which she and Rose Bowker designed.

You can help in Phase II of our fund raising to save the Elfin Forest. With \$500,000 behind us, it's easier to convince prospects that saving this last unique bayfront property is possible. Call Barbara Machado at 528-3835 if you want materials and pledge cards.

I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds.


I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water
